MESSAGE FROM HIGHWAYS / ROAD SAETY IN VALE

As we commence a new academic year, your school crossing patrol (SCP) has raised concerns about the safety of children and adults crossing Trinity Street due to a couple of recent incidents where drivers have parked inconsiderately across the dropped kerbs, blocking access to pavement areas.

SCP's are not a statutory function but are provided by this Authority to assist with the safety of all pedestrians on their journey to and from local schools. They operate at designated sites where there is a high volume of pedestrian and traffic movement and where dropped kerbs are provided to make it safer for pedestrians to pass from pavement to pavement, particularly those using pushchairs, a wheelchair or powered mobility vehicle. The raised surfaces that can be felt underfoot at these crossing points, provide both a warning and guidance to blind or partially sighted people crossing at these locations.

Any vehicles stopped or parked along a dropped kerb cause an obstruction and thereby a danger to all pedestrians. Rule 243 of the Highway Code states that you must not stop or park where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility users.

Therefore, to enable a safe journey for pedestrians to and from your school, I would be grateful if you could ask all drivers to please comply with the Highway Code. Enforcement officers have been requested to attend Trinity Street and other local roads within the vicinity and fines have and will be issued.
